
PGS-MN Mail List: An Invitation

The Board of Directors of PGS-MN has authorized that a Mail List using its name be created on the Internet to further the interests of those of us pursuing Polish Family Research in Minnesota and vicinity and areas of Poland where Minnesotans are known to originate. This list is for the discussion of historical and genealogical topics relevant to Poles in Minnesota. Discussion of migration patterns, immigration, heraldry, historical sketches, Polish settlements, census data, wills, family Bibles, vital records, web sites, etc. relateing to Polish genealogy is encouraged. Public announcements of interest to relevant events in Minnesota or neighboring states or to genealogists in general, though they may not be PGS-MN specific, are permitted but please use discretion.

This is one of the ways the Board wants to expand its services to those members who are not living in Minnesota. As the List grows, further services may be added where possible. You do not have to be a member of PGS-MN to participate and you are hereby invited to participate.

To get the regular version of the list, just send a message to this URL: <PGS-MN-L-request@rootsweb.com> (put only the word "subscribe", without the quotes, in the body of the message). To get the digest version, where you would only get one message per day use: <PGS-MN-D-request@rootsweb.com> (again, put only the word "subscribe", without the quotes, in the body of the message).

For those of you not familiar with Mail Lists, they are mail groups where you send and receive messages from maybe hundreds of people (not every day) by using only one address. You can read what others who are searching in the same areas as you are doing, their successes, and their failures (hopefully, more of the former). And you can send out queries or requests for help, or your suggestions, to all using only one mail address. There are thousands of these lists on the Internet and are one of the great reasons for its success.



If you have traveled to Poland, and want to share your experiences/expertise, let me know. We will publish a meeting notice well in advance.



Mazeroski to Hall

Bill Mazeroski, the slick fielding second baseman for the Pittsburg Pirates, was selected to Baseball's Hall of Fame this spring. Mazeroski was a winner of eight Gold Gloves and participated in a record 1,706 double plays. He is best remembered for his ninth inning home run that defeated the New York Yankees in the seventh game of the World Series in 1960. He is the sixth Polish-American to be enshrined. The others are: Al Simmons (Szymanski), Stan Coveleski, Stan Musial, Carl Yastrzemski and Phil Niekro.



Kashubian research

I always read with interest the PGS-MN Newsletter. I am impressed with the hard work put into it and look forward to receiving it. Please keep up the good work. In the latest issue (Winter 2000-01, p. 6) a letter from Scott Writz raised my interest.

Mr. Writz was inquiring after the surname WRYCA from Berent/Kreis Berent of West Prussia. It was noted that the town is now known as Koscierzna. It was also noted that searches there might reveal that the surname he was looking for might well be from the surrounding rural area.

I have been working on the surname WREZA in the same Gdansk area. In my search I had the opportunity to correspond with Adeline Sopa at 2711 Danbar Drive, Green Bay WI 54313-7002. She advised me that she had no direct knowledge of the name but was aware that a common name in central Wisconsin was WRYCZA and those that she knew had origins in the Suleczyno and Stezyca parishes in the Gdansk area. Looking a map shows both of these are close to Koscierzna.

A similar letter to Shirley Connolly, 21 Granville Ave, Ottawa, Ont. K1Y OM5, resulted in the information that she had come across the name WRYZA in the parishes of Lesno and Lipusz. These too are in the Gdansk area. She adds that it is a common Kashubian name. I also find it interesting that in a search of the surname index featured by PGS-MN at the MGS "Branching Out" meeting reveals that the Wreza surname is particular to the Gdansk area with about 27 listings in 1990.

I would appreciate if you would forward this information to Mr Writz. I hope it is of some help to him. I would also appreciate if he would watch out for the Wreza surname in his search. It is likely there is some connection. My surname came over around 1875 and settled in Gilman area of central Minnesota.

Baptismal records in Falkowice

Many thanks for your work on finding information about my grandparent's home place in Poland (See; PGS-MN Newsletter {Winter 2000-01], pp. 12-13). First of all, I was very pleased with the prompt and thorough review of the MATROS surname throughout Poland. But, I was absolutely overwhelmed when you sent the email telling of finding their home parish at Falkowice. I am most grateful.

The baptismal dates match their birth dates closely (I had their birth dates previously). Frank Matros was born on October 4th, 1866. He was baptized a day later. The same pattern is true for Magdalena Jacubik. She was born on July 22, 1868, and was baptized a day later.

Until your email, I had hit nothing but blank walls. A certificate of citizenship for my grandparents did not indicate the place of birth. Death certificates had a space that asks about their place of birth. But all they said was "Germany." No town or parish.

Editor's reply: I checked the Family History Library Catalog at http://www.familysearch.org and the LDS Family History Library has filmed both census and naturalization records for Cook County--also census records for Chicago. Going through a LDS Family History Center might be easier than going through the U of M Library. I say this because I am more familiar with ordering LDS records than using the Inter-Library Loan procedure at the U of M. I am sure that the U of M could get the records also.

Naturalization records are usually organized by date. There is generally a surname index however.

I assume that the finder system that you are referring to the "Soundex Indexing System." That system exists for all states but not for all census years.

Good luck with your investigation. The Saltys/Soltys surname appears on my ancestor chart (see PGS-Newsletter, Winter 1997-98, pp. 12, 14). The guy may be a relative--though I think the surname is quite common. Let me know what you find out.

Morrison County cemeteries

Some possible help for Mr. LaMotte (See; PGS-MN Newsletter [Winter 2000-01], pp. 8-9):

My husband and I were involved in a project sponsored by the Morrison County Historical Society where they had us locate each and every grave in a cemetery and record the marker type, size and ALL the information that appeared on the gravestone and the location of the grave within each cemetery. This was done so that all this information could be put on computer and indexed for use by the public. We recorded 3 cemeteries for this project 4 or 5 years ago. So the project could very well be completed by now.

We recorded St. John's, St. Joseph's and Lone Pine all in Morrill, MN, Morrison County. St. Michael's in Buckman is in Morrison Co. so it is also probably recorded. LIBRARY CORNER

Jonathan D. Shea and William F. Hoffman, In Their Words: A Genealogist's Translation Guide to Polish, German, Latin, and Russian Documents, Volume I: Polish (New Britain, Conn.: Language & Lineage Press, 2000) (available for purchase from the PGS-MN; a copy is in our collection at the MGS Library in Golden Valley)

During the 1990s, an assortment of books on Polish and Polish-American genealogy was published. Of them all, Rosemary Chorzempa's fine Polish Roots (Baltimore: Genealogical Publishing Company, 1993) was the only true general reference, all of the others were specialized as to function (translation guide, gazetteer or gazetteer aid, etc.), locale (by Partition or American subject), or both. As Polish Roots went into reprinting without revision, however, we needed something more for the next stage of our general research. The maturing of Polish-American genealogical societies, the expanded filming programs of the LDS Family History Library, the increasing interest in genealogy in post-communist Poland itself, and the evolution of secondary sources on the World Wide Web all cried for a guide to introduce them to researchers who'd gotten beyond fledgling status.

We don't quite have that comprehensive advanced-level guide yet. However, we do have something that's darned close, and just in time for the true millennium. Jonathan Shea and William F. "Fred" Hoffman are two of the most prominent Polish-American genealogists. Among their many joint and individual publications was Following the Paper Trail, an aid to translating documents in the major languages relevant to genealogical research within the boundaries of the Polish Commonwealth. Rather than revise that work within its original one-book format, Fred and Jon decided to expand it to four separate volumes, each to cover one of the languages, and to get into more and different sorts of genealogical data sources. Logically enough, the first covers the Poles' native tongue.

It's tempting to say that this volume covers every aspect of genealogical translating from Polish to English that one could envision. Try as I might, I can't identify a type of task, document, or communication that it doesn't treat in some way. It opens with an excellent introduction to Polish phonetics and grammar, quite detailed but very readable and accessible to the non-academic. There are the usual chapters on writing genealogical inquiries to sources in Poland, understanding the responses, and translating the "Napoleonic format" records of births, deaths, and marriages that

were ubiquitous in the Russian Partition. These are very helpful to beginner and experienced genealogist alike, building on prior treatments and offering new angles. As one would expect from Fred Hoffman, dean of American translators from Słownik geograficzny królesiwa polskiego, there is a long guide to that source, the principal 19th-century gazetteer of the Polish lands of Europe. It collates the best content of Fred's many articles in the publications of the Polish Genealogical Society of America.

But In Their Words goes beyond those expected topics, to include other genealogical sources little-heeded or not recently covered in the literature. I was able to use the volume to great advantage in translating a Polish-language obituary from a Wisconsin newspaper, and in puzzling out the fractured Polish spellings in gravestone inscriptions that I had transcribed at St. Isidore's Cemetery in Sturgeon Lake, Minnesota. There are guides to church histories and directories published in Poland, consular records, passports, personal letters, and military documents. There are introductions to major German- and Russian-language gazetteers, for their material on lands that were populated by Poles.

All of this is presented in the fine, readable style that Shea and Hoffman developed in their earlier works, individual and joint. One envisions a pair of patient older brothers, a bit quirky but very able, encouraging the reader to just keep plugging along, learning bit by bit and applying it until meaning is prized out of those baffling piles of rammed-together consonants. There's a nicely offhand manner to the explanations, colloquial but masterful. Here and there is the goofball humor that characterizes Fred's earlier works, like his pioneering collections of Polish surand first names; it's just enough to break up the condensed nature of the content. History is presented, of Poland itself and Polish emigration, in amounts sufficient to place the sources in context. Samples abound, of various documents and texts, with clear outlines of their standardized content and good explications of the stock phrases that recur over decades' worth of the originals. Using these breakdowns and a good Polish-English dictionary, and mastering the rudiments of Polish grammar, just about any layperson should be able to get all that is needed out of most forms of genealogical sources in the language.

This truly is a book that every Polish-American genealogist should own, and use regularly. While a bit more pricey than most publications in our niche, it will immediately save the casual or serious researcher its cost in professional translator's fees. Between the lines, it contains much about genealogical research techniques as well as linguistics. It's also marvelously entertaining, a good way to share the sheer joy of learning and the rediscovery of a buried past.

And there will be more, Jon and Fred promise companion volumes on Latin, German, and Russian for use in Polish genealogy. We all should hope that they realize that goal quickly.

American Polonians, 1795 to 1918: Another Chronology, compiled by Earl James Lasworth (Marshall, Texas: published by the author, 2000)

Earl "Jim" Lasworth is a PGS-MN member and Texas resident whose Polonian heritage lies in the Midwest; born under the surname *Lasiewicz* in Chicago, he has ties to south-central Minnesota through his mother's Polish-American family. Jim is an academic research librarian by training and profession. His post-retirement interest in family and ethnic history prompted him to compile *Polonian Settlements in Texas: An Illustrated Chronology*, reviewed in the Summer, 2000 issue of this newsletter.

After issuing *Polonian Settlements in Texas* to a large number of genealogical and cultural societies, archives, and libraries, Jim started a similar collection of anecdotes and excerpts with a nationwide scope. With his own gleanings from histories and biographies, extracts from articles in genealogical publications, and contributions from others, he has assembled another timeline of noteworthy persons and events in the growth of American Polonia.

The basic format is very similar to that of his Texascentered volume. Because his subject matter includes the large urban enclaves of the Northeast and Midwest, much more of the material highlights Polish-American achievements in politics, journalism, and the arts. There are also demographic snapshots of the size of various local communities from a variety of sources. As he did in the earlier volume, Jim shows a good eye for the dramatic, illustrative anecdote; the loneliness and fear of humble, unlettered people thrown into an alien culture emerges from time to time, alongside proud success in the foundation of parish churches, newspaper publication, election to public office, and even the cinema. As he says, "There needs to be some recognition of those who will never be mentioned in 'Who's Who' lists but whose contribution to their communities and their nation cannot be questioned."

This is a good, solid effort again, in which the timeline format certainly gives a strong sense of Polish presence growing rapidly from the mid-19th century and spreading across half the country. Jim hastens to say that this volume is only a start, however. He is soliciting contributions from all sources--old newspaper articles, personal narratives, church jubilee books, fraternal-society histories, and anything else that documents the way in which Poles made their place in America. American Polonians is in a loose-leaf format, which should promote the easy release of updates as he receives more material.

Though this is not interpretative history in the academic sense, this is just the sort of documentary effort self-generated by the Polonian community that I encouraged a couple of years ago in my penultimate President's Letter. As such, we all should support it by contributing material on our own families and American communities, whether their achievements were grand or humble. Church Sponsored Brides

We all have family stories that contain little "snippets" of information that make us want more. For a number of years I have been seeking more information on the possibility that the Catholic church may have sponsored women from Poland to come to the U.S. to marry Polish men who had immigrated earlier. I became interested in this because my understanding is that my great grandfather's second wife was sponsored by the church. She was quite a bit younger than him, but at an age where she would have been considered a

spinster and not likely to marry. I have been told that she came to St. Paul, Minnesota (about 1907) from Poland sponsored by the Catholic church. I wrote to PGSA, and both the PGS in Michigan and Wisconsin some years ago. None of them had information on church sponsored brides but all were eager to hear if I ever learned more. I was encouraged when an elderly relative told me his mother-in-law had been sponsored by a Lutheran church to come to the U.S. from Germany to find a husband. So I feel this was actually practice by some churches. Does anyone else have any family evidence or information that will verify this practice?
